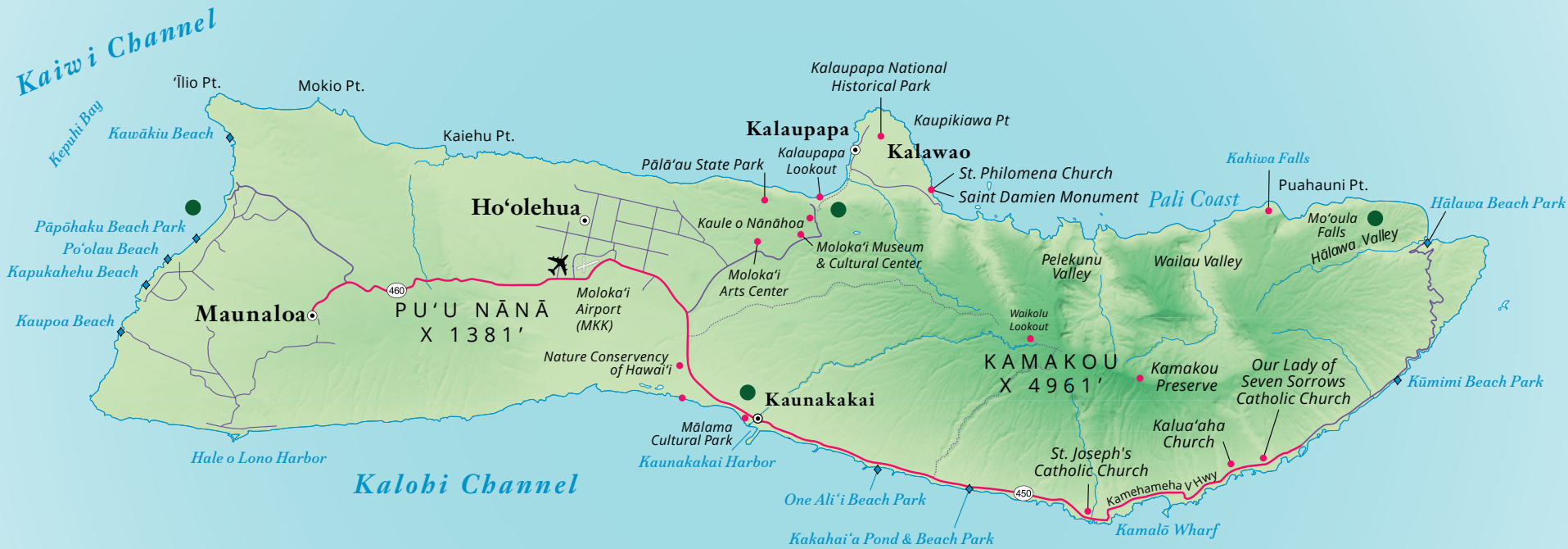


MOLOKA'I

Approximate Driving Times

From Moloka'i Airport (MKK) to:

Hālawā Valley	2 hrs (35 miles)
Kaunakakai	15 min (8 miles)
Maunaloa	20 min (11 miles)

Sheltered within 28 miles of fringed reef on the southern shore, Moloka'i retains much of the flavor of "old Hawai'i."

● Hālawā Valley

Hikers are astounded by this valley's rich flora and beautiful vistas. Be careful of the many hidden heiau (sacred temple sites), it's easy to see why this is one of the island's more cultural and sacred areas. At the trail's end is the impressive, 250-foot, double tiered Mo'oula Falls, a perfect place to rest and have lunch. The hike is fairly vigorous, and the only way to access the area is with a guide, as the trail crosses private property.

● Pāpōhaku Beach Park

Pāpōhaku Beach is one of Hawai'i's largest white sand beaches, so there's plenty of room to spread out and enjoy the ambiance. You'll also find campsites, indoor and outdoor showers, as well as picnic and restroom facilities.

● Kaunakakai

This area's long wharf forms the island's main harbor, with charter boats for fishing, snorkeling and seasonal whale-watching. The town's main strip, Ala Malama Street, was named after the nearby house used by King Kamehameha V in the 1860s. This charming town has a little bit of everything, including groceries, hardware, a pharmacy, a gourmet wine and spirits shop, an art gallery, a gift shop and a famous bakery in its business district and not a single stoplight on the island.

● Kalaupapa Lookout

Kalaupapa Lookout, located in Pala'au State Park, offers breathtaking views of one of the world's tallest sea cliffs and the historic Kalaupapa Peninsula below. From this scenic spot, you can marvel at the dramatic beauty of the cliffs, lush landscapes and the secluded village that once served as a refuge for those with Hansen's disease. This peaceful place invites reflection and appreciation of Moloka'i's natural beauty and deep cultural history.
